Governing Council Meeting



Mobile Phones

Student use of personal devices at school:

All students are required to keep their personal devices 'off and away' between the start and end of each school day and while they are attending authorised school activities off-site, such as camps and excursions.

Students may only access their personal devices during these times if they have received an approved <u>exemption</u> from their school to use the device for a specific, agreed reason.

Access refers to both physical access, including wearing any wearable technology that fits the definition of personal devices in this policy, and remote access, such as connecting other technology to the personal device's hotspot or using headphones that are paired to the personal device.

Mid-Year Intake

A mid-year intake into preschool and school is starting in 2023. Parents can enrol children born in the middle of the year at a time appropriate to their age and their stage of development.

Mid-year intake will start in: preschools in 2023 and schools in 2024.

Term 3, 2023 – July intake (mid-year) Children who turn 4 years old from 1 May to 31 October can commence preschool at the start of term 3. All preschool children will receive 600 hours of preschool across 4 terms. Children starting preschool in the 2023 mid-year intake, will complete terms 3 and 4 plus terms 1 and 2 of the following year. They will then start school in term 3, 2024 for the 2024 mid-year intake.



School A mid-year intake will start in schools for term 3, 2024. Students who start school through a mid-year intake complete 6 terms of reception.

Bus Safe



Take care. Stay aware,

A FREE, FUN, INTERACTIVE incursion linked to the Curriculum

Led by the bus industry and funded by the Department for Education

BusSAfe sessions teach children how their behaviour directly impacts their safety in and around buses. We talk about school, excursion, and town buses too.

It's a first of its kind safety initiative for South Australia.

Each session takes fifty minutes to an hour and the ideal group size is two classes. There are videos, role play and discussion in-class. There is also a bus inspection to put learning into practice and discover the safety and emergency features.

The program is aimed at children from Reception to Year 4, although the messages are universal so it's also a good reminder for students heading towards high school.

In 2022 we held over 80 sessions and saw 3,000+ students

Feedback from schools is uniformly positive. 100% of teachers said BusSAfe is a worthwhile initiative, and some are re-booking this year with a new cohort of students.



Let's look at statistics

Buses are one of the safest transportation modes, but accidents and emergencies can happen. When they do, it is usually through risky behaviour at the bus pickup area or while on the bus.

Between 1989 and 2020, there were 90 fatalities involving buses carrying school-aged children. Half of these fatalities were people not in a vehicle – such as pedestrians and cyclists¹.

Also, for every reported accident thousands more near-misses go unreported.

What does risky behaviour look like?

- Walking in front of the bus
- Crossing the road before a bus pulls away
- Horseplay at the bus stop or pickup area
- Not wearing a seatbelt
- Distracting the driver

Safety is a shared responsibility, and the bus industry cares about it deeply. Please get involved and help us keep your students safe.
