Seven Little Wonders

The PaperBoats make works for children from scratch over a 2-3 year period. They began the *Seven Little*

Wonders project with an urge to pay homage to the wonder and power of art and creation. The title of the work was inspired by Sir Isaac Newton's discovery in the 17th Century that white light could be split into the colours of the rainbow using a

prism. Because seven was a magical and mystical number in those times, Newton imagined that he saw seven colours in the rainbow (red, orange, vellow, green, blue, indigo and violet) which beautifully coincided with his observation that there are seven notes in the musical scale. Newton suggested that light,

colour, music and sound might be all parts of a whole; that they were fundamentally intertwined.

We now know that that is not the case but we loved the idea that music, sound, colour and light belong to another and that when they play together in human company they cause us to dance, connect, synchronize and find expression and joy through

art and creation.

Seven Little Wonders was created in Mt Gambier by The PaperBoats in partnership with Country Arts SA, employing experienced local professional performer/theatre-makers, Sarah Broekensha and Gavin

Clarke.

Mobile Phones

Student use of personal devices at school:

All students are required to keep their personal devices 'off and away' between the start and end of each school day and while they are attending authorised school activities off-site, such as camps and excursions.

Students may only access their personal devices during these times if they have received an

approved <u>exemption</u> from their school to use the device for a specific, agreed reason.

Access refers to both physical access, including wearing any wearable technology that fits the definition of personal devices in this policy, and remote access, such as connecting other technology to the personal device's hotspot or using headphones that are paired to the personal device.

Teachers and students will engage in weekly lessons and activities around the key principles of **Gratitude**, **Empathy**, **Mindfulness** (**GEM**) and **Emotional Literacy** to build resilience.

Student Home Internet Access Program

Free home internet access

Students and families who have inadequate or no access to internet at home are eligible to apply for a free internet connection to support learning.

There are 2 options available to eligible families:

- wireless internet access from the Department for Education through the student home internet program
- NBN broadband internet access until December 2025 from the Australian Government through the School Student Broadband Initiative.

You might be eligible if you:

- have a school aged child
- don't have reliable home internet access or have no active NBN broadband connection.

Peanut Allergy Alert

Headlice

Thank you for your assistance in eliminating this annoying pest.


School Card

SunSmart

During Terms 1, 3 and 4 (this is when the UV Index level reaches 3 and above) all students need to have a

SunSmart hat.
SunSmart hats are broad-brimmed hats, bucket hats, or legionnaire style hats. A SunSmart hat not only protects the face, head, neck and ears, it can also reduce the amount of UV radiation reaching the eyes by 50%.

Story Dogs

Melaleuca Park Primary school is very excited to have returning two of our regular visitors to school to help our students with their reading. Helen Williams and Miss Maggie will be visiting every Tuesday morning to help in our 3/4 class.

Also Helen Cottier and Ace are returning every Monday morning to help our year 2's in the year 1/2 class.

The Story Dogs program partners with the classroom teachers to help students with their reading.

Helen and Miss Maggie will help the same 4 students each week as will Helen and Ace. The students will come out of their Classroom and sit one-on-one with the Story Dogs and read to them because they love to listen and will not mind if the student makes a few mistakes. The Story Dogs just want to have a fun time so that books and reading become a joyful experience.

Miss Maggie is a long haired Border Collie who is now four years old. She loves dog obedience and agility and chasing her ball. She has a lot of doggie friends that she meets regularly for runs and loves to chase them all and round them all up just like a working dog does, as Border Collies are bred for herding livestock.

Miss Maggie adores the students that she has worked with over the previous two years. Miss Maggie loved playing



the (two feet game) that she played with the students at the end of the reading session, and the students love this game just as much as she does. Miss Maggie is scared of the school bell and is nervous walking across the school yard because she thinks the bell is going to make that very loud noise!

If you see Miss Maggie in the school yard please approached slowly, Miss Maggie likes the students to introduce themselves by not rushing up to her and crowding her, so please put your hand out with a clenched fist then approach her one person at a time, then stand still while she sniffs your clenched fist, then you can slowly pat her under her chin. Remember no hugs only Pats for all dogs.

Ace was as Rescue dog, he was found wandering

the streets in 2016 when he was about four years old.

Ace is now about twelve years old and he is a Kelpie. He went to dog school in his early years, going through to grade five then we enjoyed trialling for a while.

Ace is also a therapy dog who in the past made time to visit people in hospitals.




