1 PLAY



Make time to play with your child, including outside and traide play. Play develops key motor skills like surving, belancing, throwing and datching. Play helps develop game skills as children follow instructions, take turns, alway with others and build reclience.

As well as having fun, skildren increase filmess, muscle strongth and fractionly, and enhance their creativity and imagination.

2 TALK



Talk with your children to build their speaking and language skills. Through conversations they increase word vocabulary, promotions words better, understand instructions, and develop imagination and knowledge about the world around them. We know that by developing oral language skills we lay strong foundations which help children learn to read.

3 READ



Reading with, and to, your child sets up attendes and behaviours for later learning. Modelling reading, too influences your child's reading habits. Reading to more than books; it's reading the packaging on a breakfast box, the signs and notices around us and the stories your children write. Through books, children boost their imagination, creativity and knowledge.

4 EAT WELL 🕊



When children set well they have energy for tearing acet play. They concentrate better and achieve more. Limbing your order's sugar imake, drinking weller rether than soft drinks and securing plenty of from food area up the right habits for later in the Eating web yourself is the best way to influence your child's attimude to eating.

5 SLEEP



Children need sleep to give their body and mind a chance to rest and grow. Limiting screen time and putting in place reutines and behaviours for a good night's sleep, will see your child more afert and ready for the day. Model the behaviour you want by turning off your screens and ensuring you get enough sleep.
