School Crossing



Parents and care-providers who park on the **YELLOW** lines at the school crossing when student crossing monitors are present are making the monitors line of vision impossible to see cars coming in each direction.

We request as a school site that you do not park on the yellow lines at anytime of the day to keep everyone safe.

Causing an obstruction or danger

It is an offence to stop or park a

vehicle on a road in a position that could:

 cause or be likely to cause danger to other traffic or people and be likely to obstruct traffic on a road.

South Australians are looking at a fine of \$198 if they are caught stopped in that area. Expect to receive a hefty **\$272 fine** from local authorities if caught parked on a continual yellow line. Drivers will be issued a penalty of two demerit points which is equivalent to a \$275 fine.

Where Stopping and Parking are banned

Unless a sign permits you to do otherwise, you must not stop or park your vehicle:

- within 20 metres of an intersection with traffic lights, these are usually indicated with a yellow line.
- on a pedestrian crossing or within 20 metres before, or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing this is indicated with a yellow line.
- A continuous yellow edge line is a road marking



which runs parallel to the kerb. You are not permitted to stop or park



in these zones at any time, regardless of the reason. Even if you are only stopping to let someone out of the car and regardless of whether you leave the engine running and stay in the car.



Uniform

Our uniform consist of a navy jumper, navy and teal or navy polo shirt, navy pants/shorts/skirt and a navy and white check summer dress.

Sneakers, shoes and sandals are appropriate footwear. Slip on shoes, thongs or shoes with high heels are not acceptable as they can cause a safety issue to students.

SunSmart

During Terms 1, 3 and 4 (this is when the UV Index level reaches 3 and above) all students need to have a SunSmart hat.

SunSmart hats are broad-brimmed hats, bucket hats, or legionnaire style hats. A SunSmart hat not only protects the face, head, neck and ears, it can also reduce the amount of UV radiation reaching the eyes by 50%.


Broad-brimmed Bucket Legionnaire Style
